Letter to the Parish from the Rev'd Penny Thomson on the Lord's Prayer ...

I wonder if you can say the Lord's Prayer by heart? OUR FATHER, WHO ART IN HEAVEN...

Many of us are probably of an age when the Lord's prayer was said each and every day as a part of collective worship at School Assembly, although sadly today, that is not the case. The Lord's Prayer is in fact the prayer that Jesus taught his own disciples in response to them asking him to teach them how to pray and so the words carry a special significance for those who recite them.

Jesus started his model prayer by addressing God as our father. The word father has been translated many ways – daddy, dad, pops, papa, abba – all affectionate, informal terms for a father who is loved and cherished, and who has shown in practical ways that he loves his child. Jesus in addition wanted to emphasise the communal nature of his prayer and so he started his prayer - OUR father. God is father to each of us individually, but he is also the father of all of us, showing his love equally for all his children. As we say the words of the Lord's Prayer we might feel encouraged to know that this prayer is being said by millions of Christians, every day, all around the world.

OUR FATHER, WHO ART IN HEAVEN. Jesus was very good at encapsulating ideas in short succinct sentences. This opening line from the Lord's Prayer assures us that God is the faithful, caring father of us all, but he is at the same time great and awesome and can be found in glory in heaven.

As we continue with the words of the Lord's prayer, we ask that the good benefits of following Jesus will be seen as his kingdom comes in. In Jesus' kingdom, the poor, the

weak, the helpless, the oppressed are helped and supported by those who love God. We ask God to give us each day, enough to live a kind and contented life. We seek forgiveness where we have wronged others and ask for help to forgive those who have wronged us, and not to hold grudges. Finally we ask not to be exposed to anything that might tempt us to act unkindly, or without love and compassion towards our neighbour.

Our Father,

who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come,
thy will be done
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread;
and forgive us our trespasses
as we forgive those
who trespass against us;
and lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power, and the glory
for ever and ever.

Amen

The ideas encapsulated in Jesus' Lord's Prayer can be valid for anyone in society today, since most of us aspire to be people who are understanding and considerate and merciful. Saying the LORD'S PRAYER each day can remind us of all those qualities that we hope we might show to others, as we live each day.

Clouds and glimpses of glory By Mary Rathbone, Lay Reader

David Adam, born in Northumberland in 1936, left school at 15 and worked for three years underground in the coal mines before training for the ministry. He was the vicar of a North Yorkshire Parish; Rector of Holy Island; and a Canon of York Minster. He is now retired.

Renowned for his books on Christian prayer, David likens prayer to avoiding low lying fog by climbing up to higher grounds. He encourages his readers to likewise, through prayer, rise above the daily challenges that we all face and encounter God and the great love that He has for us.

In his book 'Glimpses of Glory', David says; 'On some cloudy days the sun manages at sunset to drop beneath the clouds and flood the land with light, every pool and bend in the river picks up that light in a reflected glory.... likewise, glory does suddenly break into our lives, but we have to make the effort to see and experience it.'

In 'Traces of Glory', he says 'prayer is not a pleading with God but rather a uniting with him; it is not about manipulating the Almighty but rather co-operating with him. Prayer does not call God down, for he is already among us, but it does transform our awareness'.

At St Eth's we, like David Adam, recognise that the regular practice of prayer can be transforming. So, we have been extending opportunities for mid-week prayer as listed in the righthand box..

Why not join us at any of these small services for an uplifting start to the day?

Or, as Rev'd Penny suggests on the front page, the daily practice of reciting the Lord's Prayer—is a great way of building a relationship with God.



Sacred rivers and climate change: The Thames, Jordan, Indus and Ganges: Southwark Cathedral 2 July By Jonathan Fisher



I attended this event because, in 2014, I had shared the platform with one of the speakers (Gidon Bromberg) at a UNECE workshop. I had presented my report on the benefits of transboundary water co-operation. Gidon then given an inspiring talk on his work for the River Jordan.

At Southward Cathedral, the presentation on the River Jordon was even more inspiring – being given by all three Directors of EcoPeace Middle East: Gidon (fromIsrael), Nada Majdalani (from Palestine)

and Abu-Taleb (from Jordan) and with Rabbi Jonathan Wittenberg in the chair. They showed the importance of the River Jordan to Christian, Jewish and Muslim faiths. They then reported graphically how the river has been severely degraded by excessive abstraction and pollution. But they outlined their ambitious Master Plan to restore the Jordan which they are promoting and pursuing although it requires great efforts by all.

Eco Peace Middle East involve the mayors and local communities in Israel, Jordan and Palestine collaborating positively in effective remediation measures that are improving water security and the quality of the Jordan and which help to build a much needed basis for peace in the increasingly difficult circumstances there. Fr Darren Collins is leading a group from St Eths to the Holy Land in 2020. Gidon has said that he would be happy to show them around the River Jordan and Eco Peace Middle East's great projects on the ground there.

Haffield House Tennis Club


Another unique feature of our community By Jonathan Fisher

When we arrived in Old Hatfield, it was a great surprise to find one of the 27 real tennis courts in the country at our door step. The court at Hatfield House is on the left at the Fore Street Lodge. So I wandered up for an introductory lesson and have not looked back since, especially when Liz also joined. We have been welcomed by the friendly real tennis players at notable clubs in this country such as Petworth House and also in Australia, France and the USA where we have played.

The court at Hatfield House was built in 1842 for use by Lord Salisbury and his family and friends. Since 1955 the court has been leased to the Hatfield House Tennis Club, and members can play on it every day with other members or guests. There are friendly matches against other clubs which include a sociable lunch. These are open to players of all standards. Members can thus visit clubs such as Queens and at historic houses such as Hampton Court and Petworth House.

The Club's two professionals (Jon Dawes and James Law) are widely regarded as the best in the country. They offer members great advice and support. They are particularly good at encouraging new members and youngsters. Anyone is welcome to contact them for an introductory lesson (see details in the figure). The professionals can then help to arrange suitable games for you.

There is also an effective handicap system which means that anyone can beat anyone. Liz beat me in a club doubles handicap tournament; though at match point, a spectator was heard to joke 'What are you doing for dinner this evening Jonathan?' So wisely I duly lost that point.

If you think there is a problem with your bank account, it is best to visit your bank or call them on their published number.

These scam calls can be reported directly to Action Fraud - www.actionfraud.police.uk or 0300 1232040 - please note any phone numbers the scammers ask you to call, as this may assist an investigation.

If you do become a victim and a caller arranges to attend your address to collect vouchers or cash, please call police on 101,or 999 if the crime is in progress.


